MINUTES OF THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD 5TH DECEMBER 2013

<u>Present</u> were Councillors J Housley (Chairman), H House, D Pepper, Dr J Bowden, Ms V Bowden, G Weatherall, A Hooper, B Edley, Ms S Constance, Mrs D Fearnley, G Oxley, B Granger & Mrs K Granger

In attendance: D J Morton, Clerk and Financial Officer, Mrs G Kress, Admin. Officer

Apologies for absence were received from Cllrs A Bainbridge and J Jones and the reasons for absence were approved by the Council.

There were several members of the public present at the meeting who were invited to raise any questions or queries they wished to ask of the Council.

The first member of the public enquired about the Chapeltown toilets and when they would be reopened. The Clerk informed her that he had written to Sheffield City Council stating that the Parish Council would be happy to take over the responsibility of the annual running cost of the toilets once the building was in a sound state of repair. This was following a survey that the Parish Council had requested to be carried out when it was discovered that the building was in a poor state of repair. Confirmation has now been received from Kier Services stating that works are to be carried out at considerable cost to the City Council and the Environment Agency and they have requested that the toilets do not re-open until this work is completed which is expected to be April 2014. The resident thanked the Parish Council for agreeing to take over the running of the toilets once the improvement works have taken place.

The second member of the public raised four issues:-

- 1. The appeal with regard to the planning application 12/03543/FUL Site at 2 Wortley Road, High Green, Sheffield S35 4LU was now going to be determined on the basis of a Public Inquiry. The resident enquired if the Parish Council were still of the same opinion and would support the objection. The Parish Council confirmed they were still of the same opinion and that all previous representations will have been sent by the City Council to the Planning Inspectorate. All additional comments must be received by the Planning Inspectorate by the 3 January 2014. He was unsure what format the Inquiry would be and whether it would be open to the public but he agreed to clarify this.
- 2. High Green Action Team had been in discussion with Kinsey Road Sheltered Housing and the residents had stated that they felt isolated as they were unable to get out of their properties due to lack of stairlifts. He enquired whether the Parish Council could encourage Sheffield Homes to install stair lifts for the residents. Cllr S Constance agreed to look into this and report back at a further meeting.

CIIr Constance to investigate and report back

3. The resident stated that there are still serious problems with the roads, pavements, barriers and lights not working on Potters Gate. There are holes 5-6 feet deep where the barriers have fallen into the holes. Cllr Mrs Fearnley also

reported that an old street light that had been excavated has fallen over in the high winds. The resident agreed to send photographs of the problems in to the Parish Council who could then act upon it and write to the appropriate people at the City Council.

Clerk to write to City Council

4. The resident enquired about whether contact had been made with the owner of Pickwicks and the poor state of repair of the building. Cllr Weatherall confirmed that the City Council have written to the owner but could not report any further on the matter at the present time.

The Chair thanked the residents for their questions and invited them to stay to the end of the meeting if they wished.

14/106. To consider informing Sheffield City Council that Ecclesfield Parish Council supports the City Council's proposals to introduce new recreation facilities in the Parish and is minded to provide financial assistance to the City Council subject to consultation, the provision of extra information, appropriate advice and assistance being obtained and an assessment of any equality considerations

Mr P Billington, Director of Culture & Environment, Sheffield City Council, in attendance.

The purpose of this item was to consider a proposal by Sheffield City Council to provide a new swimming pool and associated health facilities within the Ecclesfield Parish Council area, with the working title of "North Active", which requires the Parish Council to close the current swimming pool on Burncross Road and make a financial contribution, with others, towards the new provision.

Mr Billington gave an overview of the whole project and then explained:

- Initial cost estimates are set at around £7m. The City Council will contribute
 around one third of the capital funds and has welcomed the support of
 partners to the project who together are able to make a majority contribution
 to the capital cost. Some of the funding is already confirmed (e.g. the
 National Centre for Sport and Exercise has confirmed £2.3m) and the balance
 from other partners is provisional and subject to final confirmation.
- The City Council will decide its funding in February and is likely to propose an investment of £2.5m from its capital programme.
- The City Council would be responsible for the on-going revenue costs.
- The involvement and commitment from Ecclesfield Parish Council was, for 4 reasons, critical. Firstly, the national funding bodies need to be convinced that there is local support for the project and in many respects, the Parish Council is seen by them as the bell-weather of that local opinion. Secondly, a financial contribution from the Parish Council was essential. Thirdly, the new facilities need to replace, not compete with, the current baths owned by the Parish Council. Fourthly, the Parish Council was seen as partner in the new arrangement.
- He was specifically requesting from the Parish Council a) full support for the proposal, b) a financial contribution of up to £150,000.00 arising from the disposal by the Parish Council of the current baths site, and c) a further contribution of up to £30,000.00 per year for 25 years. He stressed that the request did not exceed the financial liability of the Parish Council to the current baths operation.
- He confirmed that the North Active proposal indirectly secured the success of the Thorncliffe Masterplan by ensuring the site was declared as strategically important.
- He confirmed that discussions with the Thorncliffe Masterplan Group had already commenced in respect of the above.

The Clerk & Financial Officer explained that preliminary discussions had taken place on the proposals currently being considered, simply because of their size and complexity, and the need to move forward within tight timescales.

In order to aid discussion the Clerk & Financial Officer referred to the following documents which he had either compiled or obtained for the benefit of the Parish Council:

- Minutes of a Working Party held on 30 July and 6 August 2013
- A Written proposal and request from Mr P Billington, Head of Culture & Environment, Sheffield City Council dated 8 October 2013 which he went through in detail.
- A formal Legal Opinion from Mr J Wragg, Barrister, dated 8 October 2013.
- A formal Legal Opinion from Mr J Wragg, Barrister, dated 1 December 2013 regarding the Parish Council's duty to comply with the Public Sector Equality Duty as provided under Section 149 of the Equalities Act 2010.
- A letter of support received from the Chairman of the Chapeltown Community Baths Company dated 14 October 2013.

The Clerk & Financial Officer reviewed all the above documents and updated members on his wide ranging discussions with Mr Billington, Mr Wragg, and others in respect of the proposal which had been placed before the Parish Council.

The members confirmed that they had studied all the documentation provided by the Clerk & Financial Officer, particularly that concerned with the Parish Council's responsibility to proceed in accordance with its duty to comply with the Public Sector Equality Duty.

Following receipt of the above information and advice, members discussed the matters at length. Mr Billington and the Clerk & Financial Officer responded to the many questions and comments from members.

RESOLVED UNANIMOUSLY:-

Proposed by Cllr J Housley and Seconded by Cllr G Weatherall

- 1. That the Parish Council receive and note the various reports, advice and information received from the Clerk & Financial Officer.
- 2. In view of the significant benefits that the North Active Proposal will bring to the area, the Parish Council confirm to Sheffield City Council that it is minded to provide financial assistance to the City Council, in the sums of up to £150,000.00 arising from the disposal of current baths site and up to £30,000.00 per year for 25 years, subject to:-
 - Consultation
 - The receipt of further advice where necessary
 - An assessment of equality issues

- 3. That the Clerk & Financial Officer is authorised to explore more advantageous ways of making the same commitment to the City Council.
- 4. That, in line with the legal and other professional advice already obtained, the Clerk & Financial Officer is delegated with the authority to negotiate and agree a draft Memorandum of Understanding/Heads of Terms with Sheffield City Council which is returned to a future meeting of the Parish Council for approval.
- 5. That the Parish Council fully acknowledges its Public Sector Equality Duty under Section 149 of the Equalities Act 2010.
- 6. That the Clerk & Financial Officer makes a report to the January 2014 Council Meeting with further details of the parish council's duty under Section 149 of the Equalities Act 2010.

MINUTES OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL PLANNING COMMITTEE MEETING HELD 5TH DECEMBER 2013

Present were Councillors A Hooper (Chairman), Dr J Bowden, Mrs K Granger, B Granger, G Oxley, J Housley, H House, Mrs D Fearnley

In attendance: D Morton, Clerk & Financial Officer, Mrs G Kress, Admin. Officer

Apologies were received from Cllr A Bainbridge and the reason for absence was approved by the Committee

Three members of the public were in attendance at the meeting regarding planning application 13/03711/FUL – Land between Chapeltown Park and Cowley Hill.

14/99. Declarations of personal and/or pecuniary interest

Cllrs G Oxley, B Granger and Mrs K Granger declared an interest in planning application 13/03711/FUL Land between Chapeltown Park and Cowley Hill as they are members of Friends of Chapeltown Park.

14/100. Exclusion of the press and public

There were no items identified which required the exclusion of the press and public.

14/101. Planning Proposals for consideration

Four plans had been received for consideration, the first plan to be considered was 13/03711/FUL – Land between Chapeltown Park and Cowley Hill – the residents were given the opportunity to voice their concerns with regard to the planning application. One objection had been received by the Committee from a local resident.

The main concerns highlighted were:-

- Loss of privacy to their properties as the track is level with bedroom windows
 on some properties. The residents feel that the fencing should be situated at
 the edge of the track at the top of the banking rather than at the bottom of the
 banking which is close to their properties. This would then give them better
 privacy and safety to their properties.
- Concerns were raised about motorcycles being allowed access to the track which would be a safety hazard for people walking along the track, and the Clerk was requested to ask that barriers needed to be motorcycle proof.
- Concern was also raised with regard to horse riding in the park and along the track which would give rise to the problem of horse fouling and safety issues for dog walkers and other users of the park.

The Clerk was requested to write to the Head of Planning at Sheffield City Council stating the above concerns. He was also requested to ask that the decision be made by the Board rather than a delegated officer, and that a site visit take place to ascertain the impact of the proposed development on neighbouring properties. He was also requested to ask that dog waste bins be installed at the top edge of the park.

Clerk to write to HOP at SCC

13/03848/FUL – Land adjoining 14 Sussex Road, Chapeltown – No objections had been received by the Committee to this planning application and there were no comments on the City Council website. However the Committee were concerned that there were insufficient car parking spaces identified as only one space had been allocated per unit. The Committee also raised concerns about the height of the proposed development as the previous application was for a two storey building and the current application is for a three storey building. The Committee had commented on the earlier application about the possible loss of light to neighbouring properties and were concerned about the possible impact that an additional storey would have on neighbouring properties. Concern was also raised about the access onto the proposed site as this is a narrow road and the only access would be on the bend in the road which is an access road for the Asda supermarket. The Clerk was requested to write to the Head of Planning at Sheffield City Council highlighting these issues.

Two other plans had been received for consideration as per the attached schedule but no objections had been received by the Committee and there were no comments on the City Council website. The Committee could see no grounds for objection and requested that the Clerk write to the Head of Planning at Sheffield City Council to this effect.

14/102. Licence Applications

No licence applications had been received for consideration.

14/103. To receive a report on the Archive Project

The Clerk reported that he had met with Chris Prescott who was working on the Heritage Lottery Funding bid on behalf of the Parish Council. This would be in the amount of £80,000 if the bid is successful. The Clerk also reported that he, along with Cllr Hooper and Chris Prescott had met with Ken Atkinson who is the Manager of the Thorncliffe Estate and who has an extensive archive section with over 200 years of archive material regarding the site at Thorncliffe. He stated that Mr Atkinson is keen to support and contribute to the bid.

Following on from this meeting the Clerk also met with a lady from the Community Heritage Team at Sheffield University History Department. She was also supportive of the archive project.

14/104. To receive an update on the Tour de France from the Chair

Cllr Hooper reported that a meeting had taken place on the 26 November – the planning is moving forward and the final route into Sheffield has now been announced. Work is to be carried out by Amey at the top of Jaw Bone Hill to make it safer for cyclists and road users. Cllr Hooper asked that an item be placed on the next Planning agenda to consider how the Parish Council will commemorate the Tour de France 2014.

<u>14/105. Sheffield Libraries Consultation – To receive an update from the Clerk</u>
Two meetings have been held in Ecclesfield with approximately 40 people in attendance. The Clerk reported that the Cabinet Member who had attended one of

the meetings gave a thorough explanation of the process. The Clerk was not sure if there had been sufficient interest shown by volunteers to keep the library open and there would be uncertainty about what expertise the volunteers would have to run the library. The Consultation process is still ongoing.

<u>14/106.</u> Correspondence - To consider items requiring a reply or response Members noted correspondence received, which is also on the secure area for them to view.

Items 3 and 4 – Petition re state of roads and pavements at Newgate Close – A resident from Newgate Close had brought in a petition signed by all the residents requesting that the road and pavements be resurfaced as they had been told that because the road was unadopted it was not on the schedule for improvement. The petition had been forwarded to the three City Councillors for the area and also Angela Smith MP.

Cllr Bagshaw had subsequently forwarded this to Democratic Services requesting that the item be placed on the City Council agenda for the 4 December for consideration. The Committee requested that the Clerk write to Councillor Jack Scott to ask that the resurfacing work be carried out.

14/79. Declarations of Interest

Cllr G Weatherall declared interests in items 5, 8 and 9 on the agenda Cllr Mrs D Fearnley declared an interest in item 9 on the agenda And Cllr Ms V Bowden declared an interest in item 5 on the agenda

14/80. Exclusion of the Press and Public

There were no items identified which required the exclusion of the press and public.

14/81. To confirm, for the period ending 31st November 2013 (a) receipts schedule (b) payments schedule (c) account/bank reconciliation and (d) budget and management accounts

RECOMMENDED: That the receipts schedule, payment schedule, account/bank reconciliation and budget and management accounts for the period ending 31st November 2013, as now presented by the Clerk be confirmed. The Chair signed the bank statements as correct and up to date.

14/82. Applications for Financial Assistance

14/82.1 Chapeltown Baths

To consider from Chapeltown Baths:-

(a) a grant application and (b) a request for cash flow assistance

Two members of the Management attended the meeting to inform the Committee of their request for financial assistance.

The first application was for assistance towards the purchase of a seated chest press as the original piece of equipment is now 17 years old – it has been regularly serviced but can no longer be repaired. In addition to this piece of equipment they wish to purchase an Intelligent Public Access Defibrillator SP1 Training Unit. The Baths have a defibrillator on site and the staff have been trained in its safe operation, the addition of the training unit will enable them to deliver ongoing training to staff and consequently maintain a safe environment for the users of the facility.

RECOMMENDED: That a grant be given in the sum of £2500 be awarded for the purchase of this equipment.

The second application was to help with the cash flow at the Baths due to circumstances beyond their control. In 2011 they had secured a loan for the purchase of pool hall windows which would have been repaid over a period of four years. With the impending announcement of the new baths the Manager had contacted the loan company requesting a re-configured payment plan to be paid over the next year rather than two year term. The company had informed the Baths

that the full amount owing would need to be paid in full by the end of December 2013. This would therefore cause cash flow problems and requested an advance of their 2014 annual grant to alleviate this problem.

RECOMMENDED: That a grant be given in the sum of £10,000 as part of their 2014/2015 grant allocation.

14/83. Examination of Financial Transactions

The Clerk informed the Committee of the payments made during the month of December and cheques were signed by two Councillors and BACS transfers were authorised.

14/84. To confirm the budget and precept for Financial Year Ended 31 March 2015 The Clerk presented figures to the Committee for consideration, he also reported that the Council tax is still not resolved at City Council level. He confirmed that he would be meeting with an officer from the City Council early in the New Year along with the Clerk from Bradfield Parish and Stocksbridge Town Council to discuss this further and will report back to the Finance meeting in January. The Clerk informed the Committee that the January Finance meeting may have to be held as a meeting of the Full Council in order that the precept figure can be set.

14/85. Chapeltown Toilets – To receive an update from the Clerk

The Clerk informed the Committee that notification had been received from Kiers that repair work was due to be undertaken on the toilets in order to bring the toilets to a good state of repair and therefore the toilets would need to remain closed until April 2014. The Parish Council would then take over the day to day running costs of the toilets.

<u>14/86. Ann Reresby Trust and all other Community Groups - to discuss</u> photocopying charges

Discussion took place regarding the above request and it was:-

RECOMMENDED that all community groups in the Parish be allowed an amount of up to 100 free photocopies per group per year.

14/87. Correspondence

Items requiring a decision or response

Members noted correspondence received which is also on the secure area for them to view.

Members noted that quite a few schools had responded with thank you letters for the Christmas grants. The pupils from Angram Bank Primary School had created thank you cards and it was agreed that a few of these be placed on the Parish Council website early in the New Year with a small article about all the Christmas grants given out this year.
