Apologies for absence were received from Cllr Mr J Housley and the reason for absence was approved by the Council.

Item 9 on the Agenda was brought forward in order that Cllr Mr T Bagshaw and Mr Stephen Gould, Manager at the East Peak Innovation Programme could give their presentation to members of the Council.

14/151. Declarations of Interest

Cllr A Hooper declared an interest in item 14/122.2 of the Finance minutes as he is a member of the Grenoside Park Bowling Club.

Cllr Mrs D Fearnley declared an interest in item 14/126 of the Finance minutes as she is a Trustee of the Ann Reresby Charity.

14/158. To receive Graham Silverwood and Stephen Gould who will discuss the Leader Programme in as far as it affects the Ecclesfield area

This item was heard at the beginning of the meeting. Mr Graham Silverwood was not present at the meeting but Cllr Mr Trevor Bagshaw attended. Stephen Gould reported that the East Peak Innovation Partnership had produced an end of project review . they have funded 99 projects at a cost of £2.2m in the East Peak area. Examples of the projects funded are:-

- Monument Management Scheme
- Industrial Heritage Support Programme
- Local food directory and Feast Peak Food Fayre
- Developing Tourism and Local Heritage
- Arts and Crafts Booklet
- East Peak Outdoors
- Installing a PC at Stocksbridge Library
- East Peak Traditional performance
- Wortley Hall Walled Garden and Heeley City Farm
- Ecclesfield Parish Council . Walking and exploring Ecclesfield PC
- Stocksbridge Interpretation Panels . Stocksbridge Town Council

There is no leader money available for funding projects this year but they are now in the process of working with the Sheffield City Region Local Enterprise Partnership with £5m available to spend in rural communities. They wish to see an engagement with the Parish Councils in Ecclesfield, Bradfield and Stocksbridge in order that they can identify small businesses that can benefit from small pots of money. They will work with Sheffield City Council officers to work through a timetable to bid for money for sustainable jobs, opportunities for training, skills and businesses.

14/159. To receive an update from the Clerk & Financial Officer on the North Active Project and agree any course of action as necessary

The Clerk reported that Sheffield City Council have agreed to remove all the restrictive covenants from the Chapelton Baths site and this will be reflected in the Deeds at the Land Registry.

14/160. To discuss a date for the proposed Macmillan coffee morning and associated heritage event

The Administration Officer enquired of Council whether it would be possible to hold a heritage event in commemoration of the First World War in the Committee Room on the same day as the Macmillan coffee morning. The dates for consideration were either the 12 September or the 26 September. It was agreed that the exhibition was a good idea and this would be hosted by a Councillor and members of the local history groups. It

was also agreed that the staff decide upon the date of the Coffee morning to fit in with the needs of the office.

Item 15 . Internal Auditor . the Clerk informed Council that the previous Auditor had resigned due to personal reasons and as per minute number 14/130 in the Finance Minutes for 20 March he had appointed Yorkshire Internal Audit Services to carry out the internal audit for the year ended 31 March 2014.

Item 16 . High Green in Bloom . Request to place Christmas tree at corner of Greengate Lane and Mortomley Lane. The Council were in agreement that this was a good idea and requested that a response be sent back to the group to this effect.

Item 20 and 21 . Trees and shrubbery at Chapeltown Baths . The Clerk informed Council that the boundary line at Chapeltown Baths needs to be cleared in order that a digital survey of the boundary can be carried out. This therefore necessitates the removal of trees and shrubs overhanging the boundary line. The Clerk has arranged for three quotations to fell and clear the site and will act upon the quotations upon his return from holiday.

Present were Councillors A Hooper (Chairman), B Granger, H House, Mrs D Fearnley, A Bainbridge, Dr J Bowden, G Oxley, Mrs K Granger.

Apologies were received from Cllr Mr J Housley and the reason for absence was approved by the Committee.

Four members of the public were also present at the meeting who wished to speak about planning application 14/01079/OUT . Junction 35 M1 Proposed Motorway Service Area. The residents were from the Cowley Residents Action Group and had attended the presentation by the developers at Ecclesfield School last year when they viewed the plans for the proposed development.

They stated that they are concerned about further trees being felled and have put in an application for the site to be designated as a Village Green. The residents requested that the Parish Council hold a public meeting with all relevant parties being invited including the developers, in order that as a point of local democracy and in respect for local views everyone's opinions are heard. The development will affect the whole Parish not only the residents of Chapeltown and therefore the meeting needs to be widely advertised.

It was agreed that an additional meeting of the Planning Committee would be arranged at a venue to be decided. The consultation date for responses to be sent to the City Council has been extended to the 13 May.

MINUTES OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL PLANNING COMMITTEE
MEETING HELD 15th APRIL 2014

Present were Councillors A Hooper (Chairman), B Granger, Mrs D Fearnley, A Bainbridge, Dr J Bowden, G Oxley, Mrs K Granger

In attendance: Mrs G Kress, Admin. Officer

Apologies were received from Cllr Mr J Housley and the reason for absence was approved by the Committee.

14/161. Declarations of personal and/or pecuniary interest

There were none received.

14/162. Exclusion of the press and public

There were no items identified which required the exclusion of the press and public.

14/163. Junction 35 Motorway Services . to receive an update the Chair

The Chair informed the Committee that Newton Hall had been booked as a venue for a Parish Council meeting to be held on the 7 May where members of the public will be able to attend to inform the Council of their views on the proposed development. An advertisement is also to be placed in the Look Local paper which advertises the meeting and also the date of the Parish Council planning meeting when the plan will be considered, which is the 13 May 2014 at the Parish Council offices. This will give residents a chance to respond to the City Council.

The Chair explained that this was the most cost effective way of consulting with neighbouring properties rather than sending out letters via second class post as is normally the case when sending out neighbour consultation letters.

14/164. Planning Proposals for consideration

Two planning applications had been received by the Committee for consideration as per the attached appendix A. No comments or objections had been received in respect of planning application 14/01194 . 36 Vicarage Road and there were no comments on the City Council website. The Committee could see no grounds for objection and therefore requested that a letter be sent to the Head of Planning at Sheffield City Council to this effect.

Several letters of objection had been received by the Committee to planning application 14/01031 . 176-178 Main Street, Grenoside and there were three comments on the City Council website in support of the application. Two members of the public attended the meeting to voice their concerns with regard to the following points:-

- Breach of several of the planning conditions imposed when the previous application was granted.
- Problems experienced with vehicles illegally parked on double yellow lines close to their driveway . vehicles have also been blocking their driveway.
- Installation of a new larger air conditioning unit which is three metres from their property which they can hear when they are indoors.

- They are also concerned that the applicant will also apply for outdoor seating when this was another condition imposed stating that there should be no outdoor seating.

The Committee are in full support of the objections raised and requested that a letter be sent to the Head of Planning at Sheffield City Council to this effect stating that the applicant is not adhering to the conditions previously imposed, in particular Conditions 3 . opening hours, Condition 6 . cooking equipment, and Condition 7 . wall mounted air conditioning unit which has already been installed. The property is also within the Grenoside Conservation area and the applicant has been displaying large advertising signs for the café.

The Committee also requested that a letter be sent to the Highways Department to request that the double yellow lines on Main Street be repainted as these have faded. The original officer's report stated that the development will not lead to a significant increase in on-street parking and will not have an adverse impact on highway or pedestrian safety. This is not the case, as can be seen from the photographs taken in the immediate vicinity. The Committee requested that the photographs supplied by the neighbouring resident be forwarded to the Highways Department for information.

The Committee also requested that a letter be sent to the Highways Enforcement office regarding the illegal parking which is taking place, particularly early morning and at tea time.

Item 10 . Lighting on Bower Lane, Grenoside . A resident had requested the support of the Parish Council in his request for additional lighting .
