MINUTES OF THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING
HELD 7 JULY 2016

Present: Cllrs Mrs Z Sykes (Chairman), M Appleby, J Housley, Mrs D Fearnley, G Oxley, Mrs A Gethin, Ms S Constance, A Hooper, A Henstock, G Weatherall and D Pepper

In Attendance: D Morton, Clerk & Mrs G Kress, Admin. Officer

Apologies for absence were received from Mrs K Granger, E Hanson, Mrs A Brownrigg, J Brownrigg and the reasons for absence were approved by the Council.

There were four members of the public present at the meeting and also PCSO Sara Beardshall who represented Richard Burgess, Inspector from South Yorkshire Police.

Prior to the start of the meeting the Chairman Cllr Zoe Sykes asked that the Council and members of the public stand for a minute's silence in honour of Sheffield City Councillor Isobel Bowler who passed away this week. Her funeral is due to be held on Friday 15 July 2016.

Item 8 on the agenda was brought forward for PCSO Sara Beardshall to give her report at the beginning of the meeting.

Members of the public were also invited to ask any questions they wished to raise. One resident had come to enquire when the Police would be attending and he was assured that regular dates had been given to Inspector Burgess who had agreed that he would attend on a quarterly basis. The next meeting he will be in attendance at is the Council meeting on the 6 October.

The Clerk introduced members of the Council to the new Administration Assistant Miss Laura Tickle who has been with the Parish Council since May and is settling in very well.

There were none received.

17/44. To receive any declarations of personal and/or disclosable pecuniary interests from members of the council on items to be discussed at this meeting

There were none received.

There were no items identified which required the exclusion of the press and public.

That the minutes be approved as a correct record of the meeting. Cllr G Oxley stated that he was pleased that the Parish Council had objected to the proposed development for a McDonalds Restaurant on the site of the South Yorkshire Police Divisional Headquarters in Ecclesfield as this is a very busy junction.

That the minutes be approved as a correct record of the meeting. Cllr Weatherall expressed the view that the Code of Conduct advice given by Mrs G Duckworth at the meeting was very informative.

17/49. To receive a verbal report from the Chair of the Environmental Planning Committee Meeting held 7 July 2016

Cllr Appleby gave a verbal report of the meeting at which twelve planning applications had been considered and also a licensing application.

17/50. Police Update on Community Issues

PCSO Sara Beardshall reported that following many reports of anti- social behaviour with regard to the quad bikes and off road bikes in several areas of the parish, the Police had carried out an operation at Smithy Wood and had seized 2 bikes and issued warnings. Incidents have since decreased and they plan on carrying out another operation during the summer months.

She reported that the Local Policing Teams are under review and due to cuts in the budget they are 1,000 police officers down. Councillors asked several questions and expressed their concern over the loss of funding for front line services.

The Clerk alerted members to an e-mail from the YLCA regarding policing of Remembrance Day Parades. They requested that the Clerk write to Inspector Burgess to request that the Police do attend the Remembrance Day Parades in the Parish as three of the services are on very busy roads and it would be unsafe if the Police do not stop the traffic. The Chairman thanked PCSO Beardshall for attending the meeting.

17/51. To consider a proposition from Councillor Graham Oxley in respect of HS2, a copy of which is attached to this agenda

Cllr Oxley stated that following the new report received today with the amended routes he now wished to withdraw the proposition.

17/52. To consider a request from Shipshape Community Health to support a new project between High Green Development Trust and Shipshape Health and Wellbeing

The Clerk reported that a letter had been received from Shipshape but he needs to gather further information regarding this request. It was therefore agreed to bring this item back to a Finance Committee meeting for consideration.

17/53. To consider the timing of Council meetings

The members discussed the request that the Council meeting on the 1 September be moved to the following week on the 8 September. It was therefore:-

He also enquired whether there are sufficient funds in the budget to extend the contract of the Project Co-ordinator beyond the date set for the finish of the project. The Clerk said that he would be speaking to Christine about these issues with a view to bringing a report to Council on a future occasion.

17/16. To receive any declarations of personal and/or disclosable pecuniary interests from members on items to be discussed at this meeting

Cllr Mr A Hooper declared a disclosable pecuniary interest in two planning applications 16/02426 and 16/02428 5 and 6 Brook Close and left the room whilst these were considered.

There were none received.

17/22. To identify items for discussion which may require the exclusion of the press and public
There were no items identified which required the exclusion of the press and public.

17/23. Planning Proposals - to consider applications received

Nine planning applications had been received for consideration. A letter of objection had been received for planning application 16/02552/FUL – 10 School Lane, Grenoside. Members noted the comments from the resident of a neighbouring property. Following consideration, the Committee had no objection to the application but requested that the Clerk write to the Head of Planning at Sheffield City Council asking that the comments from the neighbour be taken into account in the decision making process.

Clerk to write to HOP at SCC

Nine comments were on the City Council website with regard to planning application 16/02650/FUL – Nisa, 2 Burncross Road. The majority of the comments were with regard to the smells emanating from the extraction fan, which is in close proximity to other businesses and offices.

Some of the comments were in respect of the anti-social behavior with youths gathering around the neighbouring shops. Some also commented about the amount of fast food shops in the area. The members considered all the comments and asked the Clerk to write to the Head of Planning at Sheffield City Council to enquire whether this application would take the fast food takeaways over the limit for A5 use class in the vicinity as Chapeltown has reached saturation point with such premises in Chapeltown.

The Committee could see no grounds for objection to any of the other planning applications and requested that the Clerk write to the Head of Planning at Sheffield City Council to this effect.

All the members present were dismayed at this accusation and made it perfectly clear that they had formed their view on the planning application on the basis of the current situation at Smithy Wood and the benefits which will accrue for the residents of the Ecclesfield Civil Parish area, should the development be granted.

All members confirmed that they had formed their views on the merits of the application submitted to the planning authority and had not received any personal benefit from making those views known.

MINUTES OF THE FINANCE/PREMISES COMMITTEE MEETING
HELD ON THURSDAY 21 JULY 2016

Present were Councillors G Weatherall (Chairman), E Hanson, J Housley, Mrs K Granger, Ms S Constance, J Brownrigg as substitute for Mrs A Brownrigg, Mrs Z Sykes, Mrs A Gethin as substitute for Cllr Appleby, G Oxley, A Henstock

In attendance were D Morton, Clerk, Mrs G Kress, Admin Officer

Apologies for absence were received from M Appleby, D Pepper and Mrs A Brownrigg and the reasons for absence were approved by the Committee.

17/20. To receive any declarations of personal and/or disclosable pecuniary interests from members on items to be discussed at this meeting

There were none received.

17/21. To identify any items for discussion that may require the exclusion of the Press and Public

There were no items identified which required the exclusion of the press and public.

17/22. To confirm, for the period ending 30 June 2016 (a) receipts schedule (b) payments schedule (c) account/bank reconciliation and (d) budget and management accounts (e) examination of financial transactions

RECOMMENDED: That all the schedule listed for the period ending 30 June 2016 as now presented by the Clerk be confirmed. The Clerk reminded all members of the Finance Committee that they were welcome to inspect the accounts at any time.

17/23. Applications for Financial Assistance

17/23(1) - High Green Development Trust

Two members from the High Green Development Trust attended the meeting to inform the Committee of their need for financial assistance towards providing Christmas lunches for the care and sheltered homes in the Parish. They had provided Christmas meals for several homes last year via sponsorship money raised by themselves from local businesses.

The homes this year being Kinsey Road, Newgate, John Trickett, St Mary's, Ernest Copley House, Ernest Fox, Lytton Court and Charles Square and also a general Christmas lunch at the Miners Welfare Hall. They also mentioned another home but this was outside the Parish and therefore the Parish Council could not support provision of lunches for that group.

The meals will all be cooked at the Old School Café and delivered to the care homes/sheltered housing, with a total number of 100 Christmas dinners at a cost of £8.50 per head. They are also wishing to purchase 5 insulated delivery bags at a cost of £26.50 per bag. The total amount requested in the application is £982.50. As well as applying to the Parish Council for money for the event they will be applying to local businesses for sponsorship towards these costs.

Cllr J Brownrigg stated that he had a quote from another catering company who could provide Christmas lunches at a cheaper cost. The Clerk enquired whether they had the relevant insurance and food hygiene licences and whether they would be prepared to deliver the lunches to all the individual homes. As no paperwork had been received from the alternative catering company for consideration, it was unable to be considered this year, but possibly quotes could be sought next year with documentation being sent in to the Parish for consideration at an earlier date.

The Clerk reminded the Committee that grants for this year had been capped at £500 wherever possible. Discussion followed and it was:-

RECOMMENDED: That a grant of up to £500 be given for the provision of Christmas lunches, with the Clerk being given delegated authority to speak to the organisers to ascertain what amount is required following sponsorship requests and for the Parish Council to close the gap by giving a grant of up to a maximum of £500.

17/23(2) - Grenoside Park Bowling Club

Two members of the Bowling Club attended the meeting to inform members of their need for financial assistance. They informed the Committee that over the last few years they had been having trouble with their green management for various reasons. The annual cost is in the region of £4,200 each year for the green keeper. They receive a grant of £3,000 per year from the Sheffield Parks Department towards the upkeep of the green. They also have additional costs for the maintenance of the green such as various fertilizers and grass seeds. They have received a quotation from Ferguson Fertiliser Company in the sum of £1,339.28 for some of the items that they require. There are also additional items taking the total cost up to a sum of £2113. The support from the Parish Council that they are requesting is £400.

They informed the Committee that they have 75 members all paying full subs at £60.00 per person per year, they also have members who are charged less as they do not play but enjoy the social side of the club. The majority of the members are senior citizens, from various areas of the City but predominantly areas within the Parish.

They did have some junior members but these have now grown up, however they held a junior bowling event for one of the local schools which was held over three days with 30 children attending on each day. Because of the children attending all members of the club have to be CRB checked. They also have a few disabled members who enjoy playing. They were asked to provide a breakdown of their members for information.

Following discussion it was:-

RECOMMENDED: That an amount of £500 be given towards the cost of purchasing some of the items from the Ferguson Fertiliser Company in order that the Parish Council can legally claim back the VAT aspect of the purchase, thus bringing the cost to the Parish down to £400 plus VAT. The Clerk being given delegated authority to negotiate the payment directly.

17/24. To receive Grant Monitoring Forms

No grant monitoring forms had been received but a letter of thanks had been received from Chapeltown Silver Prize Band for their recent grant.

17/25. To confirm a 1% increase for staff from the 1st April 2016 in accordance with the National Salary Award

RECOMMENDED: - That a 1% increase for staff be awarded to all employees backdated to the 1 April 2016 and that the new pay scales for 2017-2018 be implemented from 1 April 2017 in line with the recommendations of the National Joint Council for Local Government Services (NJC) and the Society of Local Council Clerks.

17/26. To report on the disposal of Chapeltown Baths

The Clerk reported that contracts had been exchanged on the 28 June 2016, the sale being subject to planning permission being given to the purchaser. All demolition costs are now the responsibility of the purchaser. If the sale falls through, the building will have been demolished which will in turn make the land more valuable.

All staff have been maintained under TUPE conditions and those who wished to transfer are now working at the new facility in High Green. The old stones at the entrance will be incorporated into the new development and there will possibly be a history board at the site. Redundant equipment has been given to Stocksbridge Baths and a purchaser is being sought for the disabled lift which was installed on the outside of the building a few years ago.

The Chair informed the Committee that a defibrillator machine is now installed at the new baths and requested that this information be put on the Parish Council website. It was requested that this item be placed on a future Finance agenda for further discussion. The Clerk was requested to write to local businesses to see if they would support the provision of more machines being placed around the Parish by way of a contribution towards the cost of the machines.

The Clerk reported that various outside agencies had been asked to deliver services on behalf of Sheffield City Council and he had attended a meeting three weeks ago with Age UK. Cllr Hanson said that the Keeping Well across the city initiative want to enter into partnership with the Parish Council and it had been suggested that they write in to the Parish Council asking for their support, which is not on a financial basis and will not create additional work for the Parish Council staff. Cllr Housley stated that Chapeltown Forum had also been approached for their support. The Clerk was requested to send the information out to all Councillors, this information is also on the shared area for them to view.

17/30. To discuss the provision of Christmas trees/lights in all areas of the Parish

Discussion took place about the provision of a grant to local Community Groups around the Parish for Christmas trees/lights, as in previous years the groups had been asked to fill in an application form if they required a grant to help with the cost of this activity.

Members asked that a letter be sent out to all groups, encouraging them to purchase a rooted tree and perhaps use solar lights in future to cut down on costs.
