

Grenoside park - Trees for People and Nature



Time spent in nature has been helpful to a lot of people over lockdown, and we want to try to bring more nature into Grenoside Park by planting some trees.

The aim is to create more space for nature in the park, attracting birds, butterflies and hedgehogs, as well as creating an alternative space in the park for play, shade and relaxation as the trees grow. Just like all growing trees, these ones will also help prevent flooding, absorb pollution, and reduce the effects of climate change.

We hoped to run a several school and community tree planting sessions over the autumn and winter this year in the park, but sadly the series of lockdowns have made this very difficult. In the end we have had to carry out the planting with our own staff before the tree planting season ends in March.
