**Item 73: Travellers**

A detailed and wide-ranging discussion took place on this item especially in the context of the illegal encampments on Angram Bank Park, High Green. This City Council owned park has been the subject of at least five such incidents by travellers in recent years, which is the cause of much distress and concern by local residents. That it requires a quick and long term solution was underlined. That the Parish Council was willing to work with the City Council in finding a solution was emphasised.

Proposed by Councillor John Brownrigg and seconded by Councillor David Ogle that:

1. The Parish Clerk urgently writes to both the Chief Executive and Head of Leisure Services at Sheffield City Council urging that the City Council speedily comes up with a long term solution and action to prevent the illegal encampments on Angram Bank Park.
2. The Council seeks a response from Sheffield City Council by 14 September 2021.
3. This issue is added, including the response from Sheffield City Council, to the agenda of the Finance and Premises Committee Meeting scheduled to be held on 16 September 2021.
