- 1) 21/03962/LBC and 21/03832/FUL - Sylvester Farm, 448 Whitley Lane, Sheffield, S35 8RQ - Alterations to existing garage to form habitable accommodation and enlargement of 1x side and 1x front window of the farmhouse.
The Committee are in full support of the Urban Design and Conservation team regarding their concerns on the proposed enlargement of the windows to this farm complex of which is a listed building. The lowering of the cills would create a

- proportion, which is not within keeping on an 18th century building.
- 2) 21/04801/FUL - 209 High Street, Ecclesfield, Sheffield, S35 9XB - Erection of a dwellinghouse (Resubmission of 20/04177/FUL).

The Committee are in full support of the neighbour objections relating to this resubmission of planning application 20/04117/FUL of which are listed below.

- Concerns were raised as to the insufficient size of the plot for the development.
- Drainage issues.
- Excess surface water is cascading from the sloping site down onto the estate behind the development since the trees were removed to enable the houses at 209 High Street to be built. An additional dwelling will add to the run-off of water especially at times of rain and snow.

Also, the Council would like an investigation into the drainage and excess surface water problems on this site either prior to his consideration or as a condition and asks that the Sheffield City Council Planning Committee consider this application and all the objections before this planning application is considered for approval.
