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#### **Public Participation Session**

Two residents expressed concern about a disused building, which they said was in a dangerous condition. They reported that they had raised their concerns about is condition with several agencies, including Sheffield City Council, with little success. The Chairman explained that this was essentially a Sheffield City Council issue, but the Parish Council was keen to help progress this. Parish and City Councillor Alan Woodcock agreed to take this up.

Prior to the formal commencement of the meeting, there was a presentation (followed by questions) by Kim Seedhouse and other representatives from Chap Market. They spoke about the changes that had taken place to governance of the charity that was responsible for the market as well as planned improvements to the market more generally. They went on to outline activities planned for the market for the next few months and said that should any Councillor or Council staff wish to visit the Market they would be pleased to facilitate this. The Chairman of the Parish council, Susan Davidson, thanked them for attending and their great and hard work.

A minute's silence then took place in honour of and to commemorate former Parish Councillor Eldon Hanson who had sadly passed away and had served on the Parish Council for several years, including as Chairman of the Planning Committee. Several Councillors paid tribute to Eldon Hanson and the great work he did in the local community during and outside his tenure as Parish Councillor.

#### 2024/169 (FC) Item 169: To receive an update on projects and activities

#### a) Bee Squared Project

The Clerk reported that early interest in the project had been very strong. This was reflected in interest on social media and media more generally, with the project being covered in Sheffield Live and Sheffield and Rotherham Wildlife Trust's newsletter. Also, that there had been great demand for the seeds from residents and local schools, libraries, churches etc, and despite it the project just commencing the stock of seeds was already running low.

#### b) Community Clean-ups

Councillors Alan Hooper and Mike Levery reported on the Grenoside Community Clean-up, which had taken place in March. This had gone well with several tonnes of unwanted items safely and sustainable disposed of. The Clerk reported that two further clean-ups had been scheduled for this financial year at High Green (Angram Bank) and Chapeltown (location to be confirmed).
